	<p>Certificat d'Etudes Politiques (CEP, 2 semesters) or Attestation d'Etudes Politiques (AEP, 1 semester).</p> <p>The students follow two compulsory courses (French language and French history and civilization) and must choose at least 3 courses among those offered in the 1st, 2nd and 4th years (1st year Masters). They can choose one course taught in foreign language at the most.</p>	<p>Diploma of Political Studies in English (DPSE, 2 semesters) or Certificate of Political Studies in English (CPSE, 1 semester).</p> <p>The programme offers a general introduction to the political, social, and cultural landscapes of France and Europe, and examines important issues and debates in France today; all classes are taught in English. The curriculum includes compulsory courses each semester over two semesters. The students who are enrolled in the programme must follow all the courses it includes. The courses are worth either 3 or 6 ECTS per semester.</p> <p>Within these five modules is a compulsory French course – French as a Foreign Language (FLE) – which comprises 4 or 2 hours a week over 12 weeks (48h -6 ECTS or 24h-3 ECTS) in each semester. For the students whose level in French is sufficient, they have to choose a lecture in French. This lecture will be selected among the “conferences de méthodes” offered in the Institute of Political Studies’ programme that is compatible with the students’ schedule. This class will account for 3 ECTS per semester. The other compulsory courses belong to the field of social sciences.</p> <p>The DPSE or the CPSE is awarded to students achieving an overall average mark greater than or equal to 10/20. Students who do not achieve an overall average mark of 10/20 will only be awarded the credits for those courses in which they have achieved the average mark.</p> <p>If students enrolled in Diploma of Political Studies in English obtain satisfactory results in French at the end of the first semester, they may request a transfer to the French Certificate of Political Studies programme in semester 2, giving them access to a wider range of classes, mainly taught in French.</p> <p>As this programme is opened to around 30 students, with no or little French upon arrival, Sciences Po Rennes reserves the right to make a selection. If your students are interested in this programme, indicate it on the nomination sheet.</p>

<p>1) Nominations</p> <p>2) Applications</p>	<p>Home university announces the names of the selected students to Sciences Po Rennes by completing every data requested in our Excel data-sheet "Announcement" and return it by email to: relations.internationales@sciencespo-rennes.fr best before 30 April for an admission in September and best before 30 September for an admission in January.</p> <p>After the nomination, the students will receive the link to complete the on-line application form. This form will be available (in English or in French) in March for an admission in September and in October for an admission in January.</p> <p><u>Deadlines for application:</u></p> <p>31 May for 1st semester or the academic year (for an admission in September)</p> <p>31 October for 2nd semester (for an admission in January)</p> <p>3) When the application has been submitted with the required documents, the International Relations Office sends a letter of admission or refusal to the students within 4 weeks.</p>
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	4) They will receive an information package by email, according to the chosen study program, mid-July for the admission in September or at the end of November for the admission in January.

Insurance	<p>Registration to social security is free and mandatory for all students in France, whether French or international.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Students who are citizens of a European Union (EU) country, Switzerland, or the European Economic Area (EU + Iceland, Liechtenstein, and Norway), do not need to register with the French social security scheme. All they need is a European Health Insurance Card (EHIC) or a provisional replacement certificate valid at least through the end of the academic year. To learn more, please refer to "Student: your medical expenditure coverage" - Students who are citizens of a non-European Union (EU) country have to subscribe for social security coverage directly on the dedicated website etudiant-etranger.ameli.fr. <p>In certain cases, registration with the French Social Security system is not required. Please refer to the section entitled "exceptions" in the article "Foreign student: the French social security registration process".</p> <p>To top up the reimbursements the student receives from the French Social Security system, he/she may choose to take out supplementary health care insurance.</p> <p>There are a number of mutual funds ("mutuelles") and private insurance companies that offer a range of contracts with different levels of coverage.</p>
Housing	<p>Sciences Po Rennes has an agreement with CROUS which deals with accommodation in halls of residence. We normally obtain a small number of the rooms we apply for. This is why Sciences Po Rennes can't guarantee a room to each student. Halls of residence are situated approximately a 15 minutes walk from Sciences Po Rennes.</p> <p>Students will be informed of the result of the rooms attribution at the end of June for an admission in September and in November for an admission in January.</p> <p>If Sciences Po Rennes could not reserve a room for your students, the student association "Zephyr" will help them in their research for housing.</p>

Monthly costs	<p>(1) Housing: 244 € / month in Hall of residence (in 2018-2019) Prices range from 400 € to 500 € per month for a studio flat. Before moving into a flat, you will have to provide at least 2 months rent in deposit, so students must bring sufficient money to cover this.</p> <p>Meals: university restaurant ticket : 3,25 € (in 2018/2019)</p> <p>Transportation: 1,50 € for a combined bus + metro ticket</p>
