PROGRAMME IN FRENCH: Certificat d'Etudes Politiques (CEP, 2 semesters) or Attestation d'Etudes Politiques (AEP, 1 semester).	The students follow 3 compulsory courses (French language, French history and civilization and Collaborative Work on Transitions (S1) International Hackaton (S2)) and must choose 3 courses among those offered in the 1st, 2nd and 4th years (1 st year Masters). They can choose one course taught in foreign language at the most.
PROGRAMME IN ENGLISH: Diploma of Political Studies in English (DPSE, 2 semesters) or Certificate of Political Studies in English (CPSE, 1 semester).	The program offers a general introduction to the political, social, and cultural landscapes of France and Europe, and examines important issues and debates in France today; all classes are taught in English. The students enrolled in this program must follow all the courses it includes . The courses are worth either 3 or 6 ECTS per semester: compulsory French course and French history and civilization, the other compulsory courses belong to the field of social sciences. If students enrolled in DPSE obtain satisfactory results in French at the end of the first semester, they may request a transfer to the French Certificate of Political Studies program in semester 2, giving them access to a wider range of classes, mainly taught in French. As this program is open to around 30 students, with no or little French upon arrival, Sciences Po Rennes reserves the right to make a selection.
PROGRAMME IN FRENCH AND ENGLISH: Governing the Future : Territories and Transitions (Campus of Caen, Normandy) Certificate of Political Studies in French and English (Spring semester only)	The Campus of Caen (200 km from Rennes) focuses on questions of transitions, prospective, territorial dialogues, urbanism and northern countries. 4 courses will be proposed in 2nd and 4th year: Geography of Energy, Territorial Innovation, Vulnerable territories, International Environmental Law. Students enrolled in this program will choose three of them plus a compulsory French course. Each course will be credited with 6 ECTS . Students will be involved in outward-looking projects with partners of the school (3 ECTS) for which they will have to prepare an operational brief (3 ECTS).
