Nominations: The partner university announces the names of the selected students to Sciences Po Rennes nominating them on the EWP system for Erasmus partners or by email only for bilateral partners <u>before April 30 for an admission in September. Before September 30 for an admission in January.</u> After the nomination, the students will receive the link and instructions to complete the online application form.

Applications: Students complete an online application form. The information in the application form must match their passport exactly as it will be used for immigration documents, acceptance letter, and administrative registration. When the application has been submitted with the required documents, the Incoming Officer sends a letter of admission or refusal to the students within 4 weeks after the end of the application period.

CONTENT	Students must follow 3 compulsory courses each semester: - French language (3 ECTS) - French history and civilization (6 ECTS) - Improving French through collaborative sustainable project management (6 ECTS) In addition, they must choose at least 3 classes among those offered in the 1st, 2nd and 4th year levels (1st year Masters). They can choose one course taught in English at the most. These classes are worth 5 ECTS. Additional classes will be awarded 5 ECTS.	The program offers a general introduction to the political, social, and cultural landscapes of France and Europe, and examines important issues and debates in France today; all classes are taught in English. The students enrolled in this program must follow all the courses it includes. The courses are worth either 3 or 6 ECTS per semester: compulsory French language, one class taught in French according to the student level, the other compulsory courses belong to the field of social sciences. If students enrolled in DPSE obtain satisfactory results in French at the end of the first semester, they may request a transfer to the French Certificate of Political Studies program in semester 2, giving them access to a wider range of classes, taught in French. As this program is open to around 40 students, with no or little French upon arrival, Sciences Po Rennes reserves the right to make a selection.	Exchange students can choose a multdisciplinary program for a one-year or one-semester stay, with no minimum or maximum ECTS credit requirements. The program is mainly focused on human and social sciences, political sciences. Students can choose from courses offered in the first year, second year, fourth year and international programs. This offer is limited to lectures and some specific courses.

Language requirements and tests

All students must have at least a B1 level in the language of their chosen program. We strongly recommend a B2 level or above. Students applying must present one of the tests displayed underneath. The test must be no more than 2 years old.

The test must be submitted on the application form during the period indicated above. No test will be accepted after this period.

Sciences Po may accept a language certificate issued and signed by the home sending university.
